# From Our Pastor

It was a year ago on Easter that I felt like we were going to be okay here at Covenant Presbyterian Church. I'll admit that I had my doubts. Like everyone else, we had weathered a couple of hard years, but I could see us emerging from those hard years as a large crowd gathered on April 17, 2022 to proclaim the risen Lord. The energy was different that day, and I could feel it. I believed you when you said, "He is risen, indeed!" When we celebrated the resurrection again on April 9, 2023, it was a milestone for me and a time to look back on the past year with gratitude.

Simply put, this last year was a joy. We have reclaimed more aspects of ministry than I could list in this space. Attendance is good and we seem to be having fun together. Do you remember Kickoff Sunday in August? *Take Up the Cause* in September? John McCrosky's Ordination in October? November was amazing—we had a great stewardship campaign AND raised an additional \$250,000 for our Home Improvement Project. In December, we sang through Advent without masks for the first time since 2019.

This year has been punctuated by baptisms (Elliott, Micah, Kaleb, Nia, and William, along with Nelly on May 21) and strong worship attendance. I'm excited about our new young adult Sunday school class, which began in January and seems to have about a dozen people each week. We recently had a young adult cookout at the Conditt Daniels home with 25 people in attendance! The handbell choirs went back to Lutheridge in February for the first time since 2020 and children's music has restarted on Sunday mornings.

In April, we undertook a large HVAC renovation and successfully moved our worship from the sanctuary to the fellowship hall and back. Thank you to everyone who has helped to make this process go smoothly. Surprisingly, it hasn't seemed like a burden. It has been good to worship in a different space for a few weeks.

Looking ahead, we are returning to our summer mission trip for the first time since 2019. Our team will be heading to Ft. Myers in June. By the grace of God, I think that we're going to be okay here at Covenant.

Basically, I wanted to put in writing how much I have enjoyed the year since last Easter. And I'm grateful to all of you for your part in this ministry. I'm looking forward to seeing what God will do with us between now and next Easter! Christ is Risen!

This status speaks to the serious commitment that Covenant has made to care for God's earth. To become an Earth Care Congregation, this congregation affirmed an Earth Care Pledge to integrate environmental practices and thinking into their worship, education, facilities, and outreach.

Started in 2010 by the PC(USA), the goal of this program is to inspire churches to care for God's earth in a holistic way, through integrating earth care into all aspects of their church life. The Earth Care Congregation certification honors churches that make that commitment and encourages others to follow their example.

"Covenant Presbyterian Church is just one of the 305 churches in our denomination that chose to dedicate themselves to intentional care of God's earth this year. This congregation's activities and commitment brings hope to their community and indeed to the world.
