Minutes from Session

March 29, 2022

After a quorum was declared, Katelyn moderated the meeting with one elder excused and Treasurer Aubrey Moore and Music Director Lyn Patterson attending. After all the necessary motions were made and passed, Katelyn opened the meeting using the *Book of Order* W-5.0105 Christian Vocation: "We respond to God's grace through our Christian vocation." Katelyn asked elders to think about the fun things in their day, the trying things, where they went, and what they did and how all those were acts of worship. Members shared some of their actions and how they might have been acts of worship. Katelyn stated that the Session meeting was worship and opened the meeting with prayer.

The Consent Calendar consisting of minutes from Called Session meeting, February 25, 2022; Stated Session Meeting, February 26, 2022; and Called email meeting minutes, March 2, 2022, was approved.

The Clerk reported no building usage. Communion servers were needed for Sunday, April 3, 2022, and Maundy Thursday, April 14, 2022. Five servers are needed to enable serving both the bread and juice at the same time. April 3: Vernon Barnes, Brock Daniels, Chris Terry and Judy Grieve volunteered.

From Our Pastor

By now, you know that I am a big fan of the poet Mary Oliver. One of my favorite poems of hers is "When I Am Among the Trees." She writes,

When I am among the trees, especially the willows and the honey locust, equally the beech, the oaks and the pines, they give off such hints of gladness. I would almost say that they save me, and daily.

I am so distant from the hope of myself, in which I have goodness, and discernment, and never hurry through the world but walk slowly, and bow often.

Around me the trees stir in their leaves and call out, "Stay awhile."
The light flows from their branches.

And they call again, "It's simple," they say, "and you too have come into the world to do this, to go easy, to be filled with light, and to shine."

Oliver has such a beautiful connection with nature, and her poems are often reminders to me of how God speaks to us through nature. I love that last line with the trees' encouragement "to go easy, to be filled with light, and to shine." In some ways, I believe that's what we're called to do as the church: to help make life a little easier for each other, to be filled with the love of Jesus, and to radiate God's goodness into the world.

This month's newsletter is filled with opportunities and invitations to do just those things, including celebrating our confirmands and graduates. There are fellowship and study offerings as well as a variety of ways you can serve others both within our congregation and beyond.

At the end of the month, we'll officially change our worship schedule to one service at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday mornings, and I trust that our worship is just one more way that we go easy, are filled with light, and shine together.

Church Member Profiles

PHILIP MIXON

I was born in Columbia, South Carolina and grew up in various places in the South, mainly Macon. I have gotten my education in public institutions my whole life, finishing with my B.A. here at Augusta (State) University in 2003. I was a history major the whole time—I never switched majors—for three reasons: it rarely required a calculator, I was exposed to it growing up—(my father was a history professor)—and I liked it.

Soon after my family moved to Augusta from Macon in 1996, I took on a part-time job at the ASU library. I'd had similar posts at libraries before, but in this job I had to learn about acquisitions, which I liked because I didn't have to deal with collegiate patrons.

I had to leave this employ sooner than I wanted and against my will. Somehow, beyond my comprehension and without provocation, I fell into disfavor with two Amazon warriors posing as librarians. I was coerced into resigning immediately.

As to sports and hobbies, I played more than one as a youngster, and tinkered with many. Two have lasted until now: reading and the idiot box, (although as time passes, I seem to be doing more of the latter).

When I was a kid, my favorite vacation destination was-you guessed it--THE BEACH. But as I got older, even that changed somewhat. Now I would rather visit the mountains, especially in the autumn. Someone would be hard pressed to find a more beautiful scene than Appalachia when the leaves are at their peak of color.

My parents both joined Covenant soon after we moved to Augusta. I didn't even attend church, mainly because of ecclesiastical inertia. I stopped going to church regularly after I got to UGA, and it just stayed that way. In August of 2020, my father, Wayne Mixon, passed away, and after COVID had somewhat faded from public attention, my mother resumed attending Covenant-by herself. We're doing something new this summer!


