LOOKING FOR A LEADER FOR A NEW GAP PROGRAM

GAP has discerned that we need to find a way for people to volunteer at GAP who are unable to come during the week because they work. We came up with a vision of holding a Saturday program once a month. We will call it Second Saturday, opening our doors for activities and service from 8:30am to 11:30am. We are hoping volunteers will come from our partner churches and friends. This would also be a way for parents and children to serve together.

What the program will need is a leader to coordinate the activities each month and communicate with those participating that particular month. One thing we don't provide on Thursdays is cleaning supplies. Another need we do not provide regularly is feminine hygiene products. We picture children inside working with adults on cards, snack packs to give to clients on Thursdays or projects they create based on the time of year and how they feel led to serve.
