From Our Pastor

"Joy is not made to be a crumb."

I've always liked this line from Mary Oliver's poem "Don't Hesitate," and I'm appreciating it in a particular way since I'm eating a coffeecake crumb muffin while I write this *Chimes* article. (You can imagine what the keyboard of my laptop looks like right now.)

As someone who tends to put responsibility ahead of enjoyment, I find Oliver's idea that joy is not meant to be easily brushed away to be both challenging and appealing at the same time. What does it look like to let joy be the main course in your life? To let it be substantial and unmistakable in your daily comings and goings?

My sense is that this call to joy is part of the invitation we're issued every year when we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead – to give joy a little more room in our lives or maybe a lot more room. We may not understand resurrection any more than we understand joy, but both are holy gifts given to us by a God who loves us deeply.

If you're not seeing a lot of joy around you lately, then I have good news for you: every page of this issue of the *Chimes* has at least a little joy on it. From Aubrey Moore's report about our retiring the debt of our renovation loan to Elaine Lea's invitation to a fall mission trip to an opportunity to celebrate the graduates in our congregation to the financial gifts given in memory of beloved Covenant members – joy persists just as life persists in the Risen Christ.

Thanks be to God that, at Covenant, joy is much more than a crumb.

Financial Audit: Audit Committee completed 2022 Financial audit and submitted report.

Presbytery Meeting: Covenant hosted the meeting of the NE Georgia Presbytery on February 24, 2024. The Task Force established by the Session did a wonderful job organizing everything and Building and Grounds worked to make everything look nice and function well for our visitors. There were plenty of volunteers and we received very positive feedback. The Task Force was dismissed with gratitude for all their work.

Motions:

- Mission Ministry Team made a motion that Session move funds from Global Mission Build Fund Tithe (080254) with the amount of \$34.20 and Local Mission Build Fund Tithe (080255) with the amount of \$5,686.85 to the Summer Work Mission Fund (080823). The motion came from committee and did not need a second. Motion passed.
- Sustainability Ministry Team made a motion to approve the proposal submitted by Treasurer Aubrey Moore to payoff, in its entirety, Covenant's Renovation Loan (Mortgage) debt. The motion passed.
- Sustainability Ministry Team made a motion to renew the Parish Associate Covenant Agreement between the Rev. Karla Conditt Daniels and Covenant Presbyterian Church. The motion passed.
- Sustainability Ministry Team made a motion to approve the revised Preschool Director Job Description. The motion passed.
- Sustainability Ministry Team made a motion to create a Preschool Director Search Committee, to be comprised of Anne Ealick Henry, Lola Bell, Andy Cooke, and Adam Toomey, with the added stipulation that this Search Committee be authorized to spend up \$2,000 from Carryover Surplus in their search and recruitment efforts. The motion passed.
- Building & Grounds recommended Session approve a transfer of \$2,959.00 from Memorials to cover paint and other minor repairs to the Hallway/Gathering Area and women's restroom next to the kitchen in anticipation of the upcoming Presbytery Meeting. The motion passed.
- Worship Ministry Team recommended approval of the updated funeral policy. Motion passed.
- Judy Grieve made a motion to elect William Davis to serve on the Congregational Nominating Committee. Motion was seconded and passed.
- Aubrey Moore made a motion that William Davis serve as chair of the Congregational Nominating Commit tee. Motion was seconded and passed.
- Aubrey Moore made a motion to approve the baptism of Sophie Ann Ross, daughter of Christine and David Ross, during worship on March 10, 2024. Motion was seconded and passed.

Treasurer's Report

Dear friends,

I am pleased to report our church economy remains strong. This is a testament to the generosity of our people and the financial management of our staff and elected leaders, and to the abundance provided by God.

I have three items I would like to share with you. First, on Wednesday, March 6, 2024, we paid off our Renovation Loan debt 55 months ahead of schedule. This remarkable achievement, made even more remarkable when you consider our outstanding loan balance was \$357,439.03 as of December 31, 2022, was accomplished through regular mortgage payments made from our church operating budget, extra principal payments made from our Home Improvement Plan contributions, and a generous planned giving gift left to Covenant by one of our departed members who joined the church triumphant several years ago. For as long as I have been a part of this congregation, generosity has been a part of our culture, and I give thanks to God for this and for you.

Second, Covenant is part of a larger culture that has unfortunately experienced a rapid escalation in stolen checks and check fraud, and we have not been spared from this fate. However, we have recuperated any funds misappropriated or misdirected by these endeavors thanks to the hard and diligent work of our Financial Secretary, Co-Pastors, and personnel at South State Bank. All of our vendors and loan holders have been paid, we have instituted new practices to reduce our use of paper checks, we have minimized our use of the Post Office and in some cases are hand delivering payments to our mission partners and vendors, and we are in the process of reviewing new financial controls for both check and ACH payments that are available through our bank.

Third, and finally, I want to encourage your continued giving to the Home Improvement Plan. As per our stated intentions when this plan was first introduced, we now wish to turn our attention to the accelerated repayment of our HVAC Loan debt. It is exciting to think about the possibilities for our church and our ministries as we continue to liberate ourselves from these debts, and I am grateful for all of our efforts to accomplish this task.
