

Developing a Mission Plan

The Mission Ministry Team spent several months last year refining its focus and creating a mission plan. It was exciting to be a part of these meetings and to explore the question of what type of work God is calling us to do here at Covenant Presbyterian Church. In the end, the team discerned a focus on ministries around poverty, creation care, and our stated core values of hospitality, compassion, and inclusiveness. Together, we created the document that you see here and identified what would be our congregation-wide efforts. Our coordinators reaffirmed their commitments to this work as well. In December, the session reviewed and affirmed this mission plan as well.

Looking ahead, it is our hope that the congregation will come together to engage fewer mission opportunities more effectively and with more people rather than to say "yes" to every mission opportunity and have scattered or ineffective efforts. We believe that this is a part of faithful leadership and stewardship. It also reflects our unity as the body of Christ when we work together as a congregation rather than independently on pet projects. That said, groups within the church are certainly welcome to create or continue mission projects as they see fit, but they will not necessarily be guided by the Mission Ministry Team.

We are excited about this new mission plan and I hope that you can share in our excitement. I also hope that you will make every effort to learn, support, and engage these projects and organizations and join us as we build a stronger congregational mission focus in 2024.


