"That sounds like a good news story to me."

That's what Susan Monk said during the first Stewardship Task Force meeting back in September. She was talking about the fact that we've paid an additional \$100,000 toward our mortgage this year (which is fantastic news!), but she could've been talking about any number of things happening at Covenant.

It's a good news story that we get to come together every week on Sunday to worship God.

It's a good news story that we've welcomed seven new members so far this year and will welcome three more this month.

It's a good news story that our new sanctuary HVAC unit not only works better but is also environmentally-friendly and energy-efficient.

It's a good news story that Covenant Preschool and Children's Day Out provides a safe space to grow and learn for 63 children between the ages of three months and five years old.

If you were to open your Bible to the first page of one of the gospels, you might find a heading across the top of the page that reads, "The Good News according to Matthew" (or Mark, Luke, or John). By definition, the Gospel of Jesus Christ is always and ultimately a good news story. It is good news that God loves all people. It is good news that there are enough resources – food, water, clothing, shelter – for all people. It is good news that God came to us in the person of Jesus Christ and gave us a living example of what grace, forgiveness, and justice look like.

Everything we do as a community of faith – worship, study, serve, pray, sing – is part of God's larger good news story for the world. What a blessing it is to be part of the story that God is writing here through Covenant!
