From Our Pastor

This month's *Chimes* seems to be all about transitions. Of course, May is the time that we celebrate graduates, and we hope that you will follow the link on page 5 to help us celebrate your graduate. We will be moving to Summer Sundays and thanking all our teachers from this past year. Katelyn and Vickie will be concluding their positions at Covenant Preschool, and we are grateful for their service. And you may notice that we are marking the retirement of our building debt with a celebration in the parking lot on May 3—a "retirement party" since we are 65 years old this year!

Whenever there is a transition, the question "What's next?" often follows. As we celebrate the retirement of our building loan, I wanted to give you an update on the *Home Improvement Plan* that we began almost a year and a half ago. It can be hard to remember all that we said and did in November 2022. I found myself needing to go back and look at that brochure that we mailed to all of you that month as I asked myself, "What's next?"

As you may remember, the *Home Improvement Plan* is a three-year effort from January 2023 through December 2025 to raise funds for the purposes of paying off our 2006 building loan, replacing our sanctuary HVAC system, and repairing or replacing the roof. After we introduced this plan, the congregation made three-year pledges totaling \$264,854. Today, we are not quite halfway through this three -year term, but we have received just over half of those pledges (\$133,585 as of 4/22/24). Thank you for your faithful giving!

In last month's *Chimes*, our Treasurer, Aubrey Moore, informed you that we have now successfully paid off our 2006 building loan. We have also completed the sanctuary HVAC project, which we financed through the denomination's Investment and Loan Program. Finally, we have repaired many of the worst leaks in our roof.

So what's next?

First, we would be grateful for your continued generosity as you complete those pledges over the next 20 months. We are also glad to have you add to those pledges or to make a new pledge if you have not been able to do so yet. Jenn Harrison, our Finance Secretary, will be happy to help you with that. Second, we still have roofing needs and HVAC loan debt that we need to address. The remainder of the pledges will not handle all of that, but I believe that our leaders will discern a way forward with God's guidance.

It has been a joy for us to see God bless this congregation over the past few years. Not long ago, it seemed that our debt and our building issues might be more than we could handle. Now, we are looking ahead to a time when those burdens are nothing but a memory. Thanks be to God for these blessings that we share!


Each month we'll share a few fun facts about current officers and/or Covenant Staff.
