



This is John the Baptist's call to the people at the opening of the Gospel of Mark. Get ready, John says, the Messiah is coming! We often think of John's message in this season of Advent when we are making our own preparations for Jesus' coming.



Long before John spoke these words, God



#### Church Member Profile

#### William Caput

I was born on February 27, 1935 in a hospital in Hamtramck, Michigan which was a suburb of Detroit, Michigan. My parents had migrated to America from Europe a few years earlier (Italy) (Dad, Peter Caputo) and Belgium (Mom, Mariann Wayenberg). My parents were relatively poor and the family lived in an apartment until Dad had made enough money working for Ford Motor Company to buy and move to a home. I can remember he paid \$5,000 for a nice home in the Detroit suburbs.

They attended a near-by Presbyterian church. My dad was a Mason at one point. I can remember that I attended an evening youth activity once a week. I remember one episode whereby the girls who were attending prepared supper and we boys had to bid for the dinner and enjoy it with the girl who made it. I liked one of the girls, actually the minister's daughter. I spent all my allowance to buy her plate. The girls switched the plate after the bidding was over, and I was stuck with the homely girl, but I acted like a gentleman, and we enjoyed our supper together. Interestingly my wife and I were married in the same church many years later when I was in medical school.

During the years that I went to high school, Wayne State University, University of Michigan Medical School, and the United States Army Schools, we went to a number of churches but mainly Presbyterian churches as we moved about 16 times while I was in the Army.

During my tour of duty in the Vietnam War with the First Aviation Brigade of thirty thousand soldiers as the Flight Surgeon for the brigade, I came to realize that God has given me a unique and grateful life. I am convinced and realized that God knew me, and he protected me to do what he has prepared for each of us to do. During my tour, God protected me at least five times when there was danger as he had something else he wanted me to do later.

It was interesting that any time during my tour of duty in Vietnam whenever the general commander of the unit had to visit his troops, he usually asked me and the brigade chaplain to join him. We went to church for the chaplain frequently, and we supported a Vietnam Catholic church and a home for Vietnamese Children who had no parents. In conclusion, I have personally tried to follow Matthew's Gospel Number 25, whereby "And the king will reply "I assure you that whatever you did for the humblest of my brothers you did for me."
